2010 Winter Series

NOTICE OF RACE

1 RULES

- 1.1 The series will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2009-2012*.
- 1.2 The Prescriptions and Special Regulations of Yachting Australia (YA) will apply except that for International Flying Fifteen and International 2.4mR yachts the Special Regulations Part 2 rather than Part 1 will apply. The event is category 7.
- 1.3 The rules of each competing class and the policies and procedures of the Canberra Yacht Club will apply.
- 1.4 Any changes to the Racing Rules will be detailed in the Sailing Instructions.

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY. The regatta is open to all boats recognised by the Australian Trailable Yacht and Sports Boat Rule; trailable multihulls sailing off a CBH determined by the Sailing Committee; and all dinghy, keelboat and multihull classes with yardsticks listed by Yachting Victoria. The person entering the boat must be a financial member of YA.

3 FEES. The CYC full season entry fee paid for the 2009-2010 financial year covers this series. Otherwise, each boat will be required to pay a Winter Series fee of \$60 or a \$10 casual fee per race (free for youths).

4 SCHEDULE

- 4.1 Registration: Eligible boats will be accepted by registration (sign-on) after 1200hrs but before 1245hrs each race day.
- 4.2 Dates of racing:

Race 1 – 23 May	Race 2 – 6 June	Race 3 – 20 June
Race 4 – 4 July	Race 5 – 18 July	Race 6 – 1 August
Race 7 – 15 August	Race 8 – 29 August	

4.3 There will be one race per day for the following divisions:

- Division 1: Int. Flying Fifteen & International 2.4mR classes and dinghies with a yardstick of 113 and below (Lasers may elect to sail in Div 1, otherwise in Div 5 for the fully series).
- Division 2: Trailable yachts or Trailable multihulls with a CBH of 0.686 and above.
- Division 3: Trailable yachts or Trailable multihulls with a CBH of 0.685 and below.
- Division 4: Off the Beach Catamarans.
- Division 5: Dinghies with a yardstick of 114 and above, including some Lasers.

4.4 The scheduled time of the first warning signal each race day is 1300hrs.

5 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS. The sailing instructions will be available before 1200hrs Friday 22 May at the Canberra Yacht Club.

6 RADIO COMMUNICATION. A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

7 PRIZES. Prizes will be given as follows: Race by race divisional results will be announced in the Sailors' Cabin after each race and prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Race Officer on that day. Any prize pool will be distributed at the conclusion of the Regatta and will be allocated on the basis of a combination of sailing performance and participation.

8 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY. Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

9 INSURANCE. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$5,000,000 per event or the equivalent.
